**This Week** - Creighton begins an 11-day spring break road trip with a three-game series this weekend at Tennessee-Martin. The Bluejays will then travel across the state of Tennessee to face Memphis in two midweek games next Tuesday and Wednesday.

**Follow Along** - Creighton's athletics website, [www.gocreighton.com](http://www.gocreighton.com), will offer live stats for each home game and many road contests, including each game of the spring break trip. Fans can access the live stats by clicking on the "Live Stats" link under the Multimedia tab on the left side of the homepage. There will be no radio broadcast or video webcast for the games at Tennessee-Martin. Memphis will offer a video webcast with audio for a \$9.95 fee.

**Last Weekend** - Creighton opened the 2008 season at Washington State University, finishing 1-2. Preseason All-American pitchers **Ben Mancuso** and **Pat Venditte** combined for the win and save, respectively, in CU's 8-4 win in the season opener on Friday. The Cougars came back to win on Saturday, 8-3, and Sunday, 5-4, as the Bluejay bullpen took the loss in both contests. Newcomers **Vicente Cafaro** and **Joe Servais** led the team offensively during the weekend series, going 5-for-9 and 4-for-9, respectively.

**Scouting Creighton** - The Bluejays made an uncharacteristic four errors in the weekend series at Washington State. CU has ranked among the national leaders in fielding percentage and double plays the past four seasons.

The team's biggest question mark entering the season, the bullpen, proved to be shaky on opening weekend. Although each player threw well at times, junior **Jeremy Hauer** and redshirt freshman **Joe Bonfe**, suffered losses in relief. One bright spot in the bullpen was sophomore left-hander **T.J. Roemmich**, who struck out two batters in an inning of work.

At the plate, a trio of newcomers led the way. Middle infielder **Vicente Cafaro**, utility man **Joe Servais** and right fielder **Nick**

**Nordgren** combined for 12 hits, four doubles and seven runs in their first weekend as Bluejays. Nordgren added CU's only home run of the weekend on Sunday. The Jays executed nine sacrifice bunts in the WSU series, after setting a school record with 93 in 2007.

**Scouting Tennessee-Martin** - The Skyhawks started their season with three losses at a tournament in South Carolina. UTM lost its opener, 7-5, to host South Carolina Upstate, fell 10-6 to George Washington and was beaten 14-4 by New Jersey Institute of Technology. UTM then lost to Memphis, 10-7, on Tuesday.

Starting pitching was a problem for the Skyhawks on opening weekend, as no starter made it out of the fifth inning. Reliever Calen Sutton had the best pitching outing of the weekend for UTM, allowing no earned runs in 3.1 innings against USC Upstate.

The UTM offense was led by shortstop Shayne Martin and center fielder Kyle Dudley, who combined for seven hits and four runs.

Tennessee-Martin, now 0-4, hosts Southern Illinois on Thursday before the weekend series with Creighton. UTM finished with a 19-35 record last season.

**Scouting Memphis** - The Tigers opened with 1-2 record at the Service Academies Spring Classic in Millington, Tenn., last weekend. Memphis dropped its first two games, 3-1 to Seton Hall on Friday and 1-0 to Ohio State on Saturday, before rebounding for a 4-3 win over Air Force Sunday afternoon. On Tuesday, Memphis defeated Tennessee-Martin, 10-7, to improve to 2-2 on the young season.

The Tigers' pitching has been impressive early on, combining for a 1.67 ERA after the first three contests. The pitching staff has recorded 27 strikeouts in 27 innings, led by a five-strikeout performance by Marcus Barnes in two innings of relief against Air Force.

Memphis has struggled at the plate in its first three games, hitting just .181 as a team. Tiger batters have struck out 33 times, including 14 times in the loss to Ohio State.

Before facing Creighton, Memphis hosts Murray State on Wednesday and a three-game series against Ohio this weekend. Memphis finished 36-27 in 2007, earning an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament before losing to Michigan and Austin Peay.

**Series History** - Creighton has never faced Tennessee-Martin or Memphis in baseball. The Bluejays are 5-2 all-time against teams from the Ohio Valley Conference and 1-2 against schools in Conference USA. CU is 5-0 against teams from the state of Tennessee in recorded school history.

**The Coaches** - Tennessee-Martin is led by 10th-year head coach Victor "Bubba" Cates. After starting the season 0-4, Cates now has a 137-342-1 record with the Skyhawks. He is 392-503-1 overall in 19 seasons as a collegiate head coach.

Memphis is coached by fourth-year head man Daron Schoenrock, who is now 83-99 with the Tigers after opening the season 2-2. He is 108-151 overall in his six-year career.

Creighton head coach **Ed Servais** is 160-80 (.667) in five seasons with the Bluejays. His teams have averaged nearly 40 wins per season and he has been named MVC Coach of the Year three times in his first four seasons.

**Tennessee Flashback** - Creighton finished 5-0 on a road trip to the state of Tennessee in 2006, which came in the middle of a 15-game winning streak that season. The Jays defeated Vanderbilt (5-4), Belmont (13-5) and Tennessee Tech (17-3, 18-10, 8-5) in games played March 7-12.

**Road From Omaha** - In four seasons under head coach **Ed Servais**, Creighton has compiled a 69-49 record in true road games. This includes a 16-8 mark during the 2007 season and a 1-2 mark so far in 2008.

**Last Season** - Creighton finished 2007 with its second 45-win season in the past three years, ending with a 45-16 record. The Bluejays came in second in the Missouri Valley Conference with a 19-5 mark, for the best MVC winning percentage in school history. The team captured its first MVC Tournament title in school history, defeating 12th-ranked Wichita State in the championship game. The Jays advanced to their eighth NCAA Tournament in school history, finishing with a win over Albany and losses to Oklahoma State and Arkansas.

es. The Bluejays were picked fourth last season, but finished second in the final standings. In addition, first baseman **Darin Ruf**, starting pitcher **Ben Mancuso** and relief pitcher **Pat Venditte** were named to the 14-member all-MVC Preseason Team.

**Caliente Cafaro** - Junior college transfer **Vicente Cafaro** had an impressive debut in Creighton's season-opening win over Washington State on Feb. 22. The middle infielder from Venezuela went 4-for-4 with two doubles, an RBI and two runs scored in the 8-4 CU win. Cafaro then hit safely in his first at bat the following day to start his career with five hits in his first five at bats. He also displayed a good glove in the field, posting eight putouts and a team-best nine assists during the season-opening series.

**Preseason Recognition** - Senior ambidextrous pitcher **Pat Venditte**, the 2007 MVC Tournament MVP, has received a multitude of preseason honors. He was chosen to the Golden Spikes and Brooks Wallace player of the year watch lists. He was also named a first-team preseason All-American by Rivals.com and Ping! Baseball and a second-team choice by the NCBWA and *Collegiate Baseball*. Fellow senior pitcher **Ben Mancuso**, the reigning MVC Pitcher of the Year, was also named to the Brooks Wallace Watch List and was voted a third-team preseason All-American by the NCBWA and Ping! Baseball.

**More On Venditte** - The only known ambidextrous pitcher in the country, **Pat Venditte**, currently is tied for fourth on the CU career appearances chart after two outings against Washington State on opening weekend. Last season, Venditte displayed his versatility by making a school-record 38 appearances, in which he used both arms 30 times. More impressive is the fact he struck out batters using both arms in 10 of the 30 games he switch pitched. In his two appearances in 2008, Venditte has used and recorded a strikeout with both arms in each outing.

**ERA Records** - During his standout 2007 campaign, Venditte established a new school record with a 1.88 earned run average. This number was aided by a 43.2-inning scoreless streak from April 11 to May 26, which spanned 17 appearances. With a 1.42 ERA after two appearances this season, Venditte now boasts a 2.57 career ERA to rank first in school history.

**Making the Sacrifice** - Creighton set a school and Missouri Valley Conference record with 93 sacrifice bunts in 2007. The total ranked third

nationally and sixth in NCAA history. Of the 93 runners advanced on a sacrifice, 62 came around to score. Three players from the 2007 team recorded at least 15 sacrifices to each rank among the top-four in CU single-season history. In the first three games of the 2008 season, the Jays have already managed nine sacrifice bunts.

**Black and Blue(jays)** - The 2007 squad also set a school record after being hit by 116 pitches during the season, which was one shy of national leader UC-Irvine. Seven players were hit by at least nine pitches, including new NCAA single-season record holder **Robbie Knight**, who was beamed 35 times. So far in 2008, Creighton batters have been hit by four pitches.

**Knight Needing Armor** - Sophomore center fielder **Robbie Knight** was hit by an NCAA record 35 pitches last season, including 11 times when leading off a game. He tallied seven games in which he was beamed more than once and set a school record with four HBP against Oklahoma on March 7 of last season. After playing only one season, Knight is already 10 HBP away from tying the CU career record. Despite the repeated drillings, Knight missed only one game in 2007.

**Turning Two** - Creighton led the MVC last season with 77 double plays. In 2005, the Bluejays led the country in the category with 85 twin-killers. CU ended last season with at least one double play in 38 of the last 41 games. The Jays continued that trend with two double plays Friday and one Saturday against Washington State.

**Jays in the Pros** - Three players from the 2007 squad were drafted in last June's MLB Draft. Pitcher **Marc Lewis** was a 20th-round selection of the Florida Marlins, catcher **Chris Gradoville** was selected in the 24th round by the Texas Rangers and pitcher **Pat Venditte** was chosen in the 45th round by the New York Yankees. Infielder **Chad Ogden** also signed a free agent contract with the Rangers. In addition freshman shortstop **Elliot Soto** was a 13th-round pick of the Minnesota Twins. Venditte and Soto both turned down the opportunity to play professionally and will be part of the 2008 Bluejay team.

**Who Needs A Day Off?** - Junior first baseman **Darin Ruf**, the 2007 MVC Player of the Year, has started all 116 games he has played in his career, including all 61 contests last season and all three this season. Ruf was on the field at first base every inning of every game last season.

**Mr. Productivity** - Ruf led Creighton and ranked in the top-five of the MVC last season in 10 different offensive categories, including batting average (.374), on-base percentage (.463), slugging percentage (.587), total bases (135), doubles (19), RBIs (57), hits (86), runs (53), walks (35) and home runs (8).

Ed Servais enters his fifth season at the helm of the Bluejay baseball program in 2008. His .667 winning percentage is the best in school history and he has averaged nearly 40 wins a season during his time as head coach. Servais has taken the Jays to two NCAA Tournaments and has won the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year award three times in his four seasons.

Since his promotion to head coach in 2004, Creighton has won its first MVC regular-season (2005) and tournament (2007) championships in school history. The Jays led the nation in fielding percentage in 2004 and double plays in 2006.

Servais has tutored six All-Americans and has seen nine players sign with Major League organizations. In four years, Creighton has produced 12 first-team all-MVC selections.

Prior to taking over as head coach in 2004, Servais served as an assistant coach with the Bluejays for six seasons. He previously was an assistant coach at Iowa State and held head coaching jobs at Viterbo and Saint Mary's (Minn.).

• CU was 28-5 last season when **Michael Lam** started at second base, and is 1-0 this season.

• CU returns four players who had 12 or more multi-hit games in 2007: **Darin Ruf** (22), **Robbie Knight** (16), **Michael Lam** (12) and **Steve Winkelmann** (12). Ruf leads all current players with 32 career multi-hit games. Newcomers **Joe Servais** and **Vicente Cafaro** have CU's only multi-hit games in 2008.
